# **BC Cancer** Protocol Summary for Topical Therapy for Ocular Malignancies Using Interferon-Alfa-2B Eye Drops

**Tumour Group** Ocular and orbital

## **ELIGIBILITY:**

- malignant melanoma of the conjunctiva
- ocular surface squamous neoplasia (OSSN), also known as conjunctival-corneal intraepithelial neoplasia (CCIN)

## **EXCLUSIONS:**

Pre-malignant primary acquired melanosis

## **TESTS:**

Baseline: biopsy of lesion

If clinically indicated: incomplete regression

# PREMEDICATIONS:

no antiemetics required

#### TREATMENT:

Drug	Dose	BC Cancer Administration Guideline
Interferon-Alfa-2B	1 million units/mL drops, qid for 7-28 days	Topical

- Repeat every 7 days x 2-3 cycles.
- Discontinue if no response after 3 cycles.

## PRECAUTIONS:

- 1. Temporary occlusion of punctum
- 2. Vasoline barrier on lid to prevent burning
