
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Section 2 » Regional Demographics





Figure 2-2: Distribution of BC Land Massⁱⁱ

This section provides a snapshot of the population demographics in the health regions. various different distributions displayed in the pie-charts in Figure 2-1 and Figure 2-2 illustrates the unique service delivery challenges across the regions with the greatest contrast between NH and FH. is responsible for the health of 35% of the population within a service delivery area comprising 2% of the provincial land mass while NH is responsible for the health of 7% of the population across 67% of the provincial land mass. regional characteristics across our



province present unique challenges to every health authority's physical infrastructure. Further comparisons show that some HSDAs have virtually no rural areas while other HSDAs meet the needs of a nearly 50% rural population (Figure 2-3).

Figure 2-1: Distribution of BC Population¹
